

I am the owner of the Freddie Mercury wristband that appeared on “The One” television show on Channel 7, 22nd July, 2008. It was given to me by Jim Jenkins, a very well know expert in all Queen related matters. It was worn by Freddie Mercury in a 1979 show at Newcastle, England after which he gave the wristband to Jim, who was a devoted fan at the time.

I have been considerably obsessed with the life and times of Freddie Mercury for many years. I also play the part of Freddie Mercury in The Australian Queen Tribute Show.

I was present at the taping session for this show.

I can personally verify that Shé’s ability to gain information about the one time owner of this wristband was nothing short of amazing!

Almost all of her comments regarding Freddie Mercury were accurate as follows:

*‘This person put 110% into their performance’*– That was certainly true of Freddie Mercury.

Shé kept complaining of sore & heavy legs and stated that she got a feeling of falling over. It is a little known fact that in the last few weeks of Freddie Mercury’s life he had extremely weak legs. In the filming of his last ever video (These Are The Days Of Our Lives) it was reported by people close to Freddie that he kept falling backwards onto some cushions/pillows that had been set up for him as he was unable to stand for extended periods of time. He had also been suffering for a few years with a legion on one of the soles of his feet that caused him a great deal of pain right to the very end.

Shé commented that there was an *‘unusual sharp angled room in this person’s home’*. It is also a little known fact that there was an octagonal shaped room in Freddie’s house.

Shé commented that she could hear a lot of guitars around this person. This may seem obvious as the topic of the show was rock stars, however Queen’s guitarist, Brian May was very well known for creating harmonies with his guitar and then layering them to produce a large sound. The sound of guitar is definitely a very defining factor of Freddie’s music.

Shé mentioned that the name John was prominent. This is pertinent in that John Deacon was the Bass player for Queen. John was the last person to join the band and was probably the closest to Freddie. Freddie took John under his wing and protected him in many ways, especially in the early years. John has totally withdrawn from the limelight since Freddie’s death.

Shé mentioned the King Tarot card in her reading. This amazed me due to the obvious regal / royal link. Also Freddie Mercury would often finish his show with a King’s Crown on his head...

I truly feel that Shé's reading of Freddie Mercury's armband was extremely accurate. I also feel that whilst Molly Meldrum and Glen A. Baker are certainly experts on the topic of Rock Music in general, that someone who knows a lot about Freddie Mercury's life in particular will be able to verify that many of the things She picked up on were indeed far more accurate than she was given credit for.
